MAHE ISLAND

Saturday night and Sunday Barbeques on Beau Vallon Bay

The gorgeous stretch of beach on Mahe, directly in front of Berjaya Beau Vallon Bay and Coral Strand Hotels, comes alive on Saturday nights and Sundays as locals and tourists alike come together to experience the best of Seychelles food and culture over a barbeque on the beach. Enjoy a local Takamaka Rum Cocktail as the sunsets behind you and the waves crash at our feet.

Mission Lodge

Once the site of a farm and boarding school for slave children, Mission Lodge offers a few scattered ruins and undoubtedly one of the best views of Mahe's west coast. With the ocean stretched out in front of you, granite peaks and lush vegetation surrounding you one will be hard pressed to find any fault with one of Mother Nature's best views. Check the treetops as you make your way back to your car as fruit bats (eaten by locals) can sometimes be seen hanging upside down from the branches.

Rum Distillery

The Trois Freres Distillery was built and developed by brothers Richard and Bernadr d'Offay back in 2002. Their vision was driven by a desire to provide the Seychelles island with high quality rum based on their grandfather's original recipe. "Takamaka Bay" dark rum was created. Since then, the Takamaka Bay family of products has grown to include white rum, coco rum and vodka, all of which adhered to the original high quality vision. The distillery also offers a restaurant, which serves an array of meals to delight the palate.

Saturday morning shopping at Sir Selwyn Clark Market

Located in the heart of Victoria, one of the smallest capitals in the world, this morning market comes alive as fruit venders, fish mongers and spice traders come together to sell their prize produce.

PRASLIN ISLAND

Vallee De Mai – UNESCO World Heritage Site


Once believed to be the site of the Garden of Eden, the Vallee De Mai is a wonderland of palms, coco de mers and creepy crawlies. It constitutes the smallest world heritage site in the world but is home to over 6 000 coco-de-mer trees, six species of endemic palms and the rare black parrot. The sky is almost completely blocked out by the huge palm leaves, which act as natural umbrellas when it rains. The best day to visit is Mondays as local workers crack open the coco de mers and skin the nuts while you look on.

Anse Lazio

Voted as one of the top 10 beaches in the world, Anse Lazio demands a spot on the top of your 'Places to see' list. It is framed by giant granite boulders and is surrounded by tropical palms. LA DIGUE ISLAND

Anse Source d'Argent

Loved by filmmakers and photographers alike, Anse Source d'Argent is one of the most photographed beaches in the world. The reef protects the beach resulting in warm, shallow waters that are crystal clear. It is also the perfect beach for children as there are no rocks or other sharp objects underfoot.

Bicycle Tour Of La Digue

BIRD ISLAND

Bird Island constitutes 170 acres of complete natural indulgence free of the modern technology of TV's, radios and in room telephones.

The island is privately owned and was declared a nature reserve in 1986 due to its extraordinary proliferation of seabirds and other migratory birds that call this island home.
